Introduction

The Hobart Institute of Welding Technology (HIWT), located in Troy, Ohio, is seeking an accomplished President/Chief Administrative Officer with a proven, successful management record and a demonstrated commitment to technical educational excellence. The Institute's most recent President/ CAO served HIWT in this role for nine years. HIWT is a 501(c)3 non-profit educational organization and is accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC No. 000403). This highly acclaimed organization is committed to the advancement of welding instruction and technology. The Hobart Institute has a proud 93-year history and is recognized internationally as a leader in its field. HIWT provides certificated 24- and 40week educational training to new welders as well as additional certifications and custom training in advanced welding technologies for more advanced students and experienced welders. The Institute additionally offers onsite and in plant corporate training to a Who's Who list of manufacturers as well as preparation coursework necessary to become an American Welding Society, certified welding inspector.

The Institute is well positioned for continued growth due to its outstanding reputation and its I-75 corridor location, situated between Dayton and Toledo, Ohio. Interstate-75 serves as a major route of commerce for manufacturers from Canada to Florida and intersects with I-70 just 12 miles to the south. HIWT seeks an innovative, dynamic, professional who will build upon the progress and achievements of the Institute's rich history in fostering a continued spirit of innovation and advancement for the Institute's top leadership position in welding technology related education and training.



The HIWT Troy, Ohio, campus comprises over twelve acres and encompasses more than 150,000 square feet of well-maintained facilities, including a modern welcome center, welding labs, classrooms, corporate training center, and administrative and student support service areas. The Institute has established relationships with Edison State Community College – Piqua, Ohio, Sinclair College – Dayton, Ohio, and Ferris State University – Big Rapids, Michigan, for students desirous of transferring their earned educational credits toward an associate or bachelor's degree program. HIWT has trained over 100,000 welders throughout its history and currently enrolls 350-400 students per year.

The Hobart Institute of Welding Technology operates with a 2024 annual budget of \$12-13 million, has no outstanding debt, maintains healthy fund balances, and recently completed a major strategic investment by acquiring 64 acres of prime development acreage along I-75 in Troy. The next President/CAO will be leading an organization with a visionary expansion plan that will permit the Institute to maintain its prominent position of leadership in welding education and technology for decades to come.

The Hobart Gallery of Welding History, opened in 2010, is home to our nation's largest dedicated collection of welding books and tells the story of the four thousand year history of welding.



Community

The Troy, Ohio, community (population 26,432) is home to the Hobart Institute of Welding Technology and has been throughout its rich 90 plus year history. The Hobart name is intertwined into the fabric of Troy in so many ways. The town has a picturesque, historic downtown with a unique water fountain/ traffic circle. It is home to the annual Troy Strawberry Festival, one of Ohio's largest festivals and boasts tremendous recreational assets, including the Hobart Arena hockey/entertainment

venue, Troy Memorial Stadium, and Miami Shores Golf Course. Troy is the County seat of Miami County and boasts a beautifully preserved, historic courthouse, one of the premiere legacy buildings in the region. The community is home to a thriving industrial base with many of its businesses working closely with the Hobart Institute. This attractive, safe, and friendly town provides a 'welcome home' feel to all incoming students of HIWT who come from near and far to attend this highly respected institution.

TECHNOLOGY


